Dear Family of bishop Csaba, his friends and collegians, Bela Bartok Congregation, please accept from the Unitarians in Norway our most sincere condolences on the loss of bishop Csaba.

The Scripture tells us there is one time for everything - one time for happiness and one time for sorrow. In times like today words do not come easy but I want to say that meeting bishop Csaba was a time of happiness. In Norway we knew about his struggle with illness and how hard it was for him. Still, what I remember is his smile and kindness and care. His interest and not to forget his support for the Unitarian movement in Norway.

A summer a couple of years ago my then 8 years old daughter and I met him in his office here in Budapest. The bishop was busy, telephone ringing all the time. As my daughter said the evening after our visit, 'I like the bishop.'
